Description:

This selection features a showy display of reddish-pink flowers with darker eyes, smothering the plant in late spring; prune lightly after flowering to encourage a dense growth habit; wonderful for rock gardens, edging, or mass planting

Ornamental Features

Spring Bling Ruby Riot Creeping Phlox is smothered in stunning rose star-shaped flowers with pink overtones and ruby-red eyes at the ends of the stems from mid to late spring. Its tiny needle-like leaves remain forest green in color throughout the year.

Landscape Attributes

Spring Bling Ruby Riot Creeping Phlox is a dense herbaceous evergreen perennial with a ground-hugging habit of growth. It brings an extremely fine and delicate texture to the garden composition and should be used to full effect.

This plant will require occasional maintenance and upkeep, and should only be pruned after flowering to avoid removing any of the current season's flowers. Deer don't particularly care for this plant and will usually leave it alone in favor of tastier treats. Gardeners should be aware of the following characteristic(s) that may warrant special consideration;

Planting & Growing

Spring Bling Ruby Riot Creeping Phlox will grow to be only 6 inches tall at maturity extending to 8 inches tall with the flowers, with a spread of 28 inches. When grown in masses or used as a bedding plant, individual plants should be spaced approximately 24 inches apart. Its foliage tends to remain low and dense right to the ground. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. As an evergreen perennial, this plant will typically keep its form and foliage year-round.

This plant does best in full sun to partial shade. It prefers dry to average moisture levels with very well-drained soil, and will often die in standing water. It is considered to be drought-tolerant, and thus makes an ideal choice for a low-water garden or xeriscape application. It is not particular as to soil type, but has a definite preference for alkaline soils, and is able to handle environmental salt. It is highly tolerant of urban pollution and will even thrive in inner city environments. Consider covering it with a thick layer of mulch in winter to protect it in exposed locations or colder microclimates. This particular variety is an interspecific hybrid. It can be propagated by cuttings; however, as a cultivated variety, be aware that it may be subject to certain restrictions or prohibitions on propagation.
