



Rose (Hybrid Tea), Lasting Peace

Description:

This variety is noted for its fragrant, luminous coral flowers that repeat in flushes all season; remove spent blooms to encourage re-blooming; excellent for foundations, massing, or containers

Ornamental Features

Rose (Hybrid Tea), Lasting Peace features showy fragrant double coral-pink flowers with gold eyes at the ends of the branches from late spring to mid fall. The flowers are excellent for cutting. It has olive green deciduous foliage. The glossy oval compound leaves do not develop any appreciable fall color.

Landscape Attributes

Rose (Hybrid Tea), Lasting Peace is a multi-stemmed deciduous shrub with an upright spreading habit of growth. Its average texture blends into the landscape, but can be balanced by one or two finer or coarser trees or shrubs for an effective composition.

This is a high maintenance shrub that will require regular care and upkeep, and is best pruned in late winter once the threat of extreme cold has passed. Gardeners should be aware of the following characteristic(s) that may warrant special consideration;

- Spiny

Planting & Growing

Rose (Hybrid Tea), Lasting Peace will grow to be about 5 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 4 feet. It tends to fill out right to the ground and therefore doesn't necessarily require facer plants in front, and is suitable for planting under power lines. It grows at a fast rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 20 years.

This shrub should only be grown in full sunlight. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions, but will not tolerate standing water. This plant should be periodically fertilized throughout the active growing season with a specially-formulated acidic fertilizer. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is highly tolerant of urban pollution and will even thrive in inner city environments. This particular variety is an interspecific hybrid.

Special Attributes

Pre-spring Cleanup for Hybrid Tea Roses in Late January into February cut back to about 24 inches tall. Remove criss-crossing canes, thin out a fifth of the older canes, remove dead or weak canes, clean up any damage, open up the center. Deadhead after blooming.
